He is the most powerful and there is no one equal to him - in any aspect.

According to Hadith, Surah Ikhlas is equal to a third of the Quran.

INTERESTING FACTS

The Quran was revealed to prophet Muhammad (PBUH) over 1400 years ago. These words were put into the prophet's heart and he would tell the people. These messages were memorized and collected together in writing. The Quran is the word of Allah and is a guidance for mankind.

The Quran has never been changed.



WHO WAS ABDUL MUTALLIB?



Harith was the chief of Makkah. He was very popular and was credited for establishing the trade routes to Palestine Yemen and Syria. This allowed the caravans to make two trips in the year, one in the summer and one in the winter. Through this trade Makkah prospered as a city and attracted many people and wealth.

He married a lady by the name of Salma, from the tribe of Khazraj. She lived and remained in Yathrib. Yathrib was a popular stop off point for the caravans and she was frequently visited by Harith. Harith enjoyed his time with Salma and Allah blessed them with a son whom they named Shaybah. Shaybah continued to live in Yathrib with his mother.

Harith was still quite young when he passed away on one of his trade journeys and was buried in Gaza. Shaybah, the son of Salma and Harith, continued to live in Yathrib and Harith's brother, Mutallib, took over as the chief of Makkah.

Mutallib heard a lot about his nephew Shaybah. Mutallib decided that he would visit Shaybah in Yathrib and try and bring him back to Makkah with him. Although this seemed straight forward, Shaybah refused to leave Yathrib without permission from his mother.

Mutallib spoke at great lengths with Salma and explained to her the benefits of Shaybah moving to Makkah. He told her that Makkah offered many more opportunities for a bright youth than Yathrib had to offer. He told her that maybe in the fullness of time he may become the chief of Makkah, just like his father Harith.

Eventually she agreed and decided to send Shaybah, under the supervision of his uncle. Mutallib mounted his camel and put Shaybah on the saddle with him and headed to Makkah. On arrival in Makkah, the people saw this youngster on the back of the camel with Mutallib and assumed that he was the slave of Mutallib. They began to call Shaybah Abdul Mutallib, the slave of Mutallib.

They were amused when Mutallib explained to them that this was actually his nephew but the name Abdul Mutallib stuck with Shaybah.

Abdul Mutallib became the chief of Makkah and was loved and respected by all Makkah. He was probably best know to the future generations as the grandfather of Muhammad (PBUH).



THE ARMY OF ABRAHA



Abdul Mutallib was distressed. He knew that a massive army was nearby, ready to attack Makkah. The Makkans were few in number and could not put up a fight against this army of several thousand soldiers and elephants. Some of them had never seen an elephant before!

The Makkans had already left Makkah and fled to the surrounding mountains. This would be a good place to sit and view this 'battle'. They knew that any resistance against an army of such size was futile.

Abdul Mutallib went to the Kabbah, passing by the many idols that were scattered around the Kabbah. He went to the door of the Kabbah and prayed. He did not pray to the idols, they were made of stone and had no power. He prayed to Allah, asking Allah to protect his own house against Abraha's army.

Abraha had made this long journey from Yemen to Makkah. He planned to demolish the Kabbah, the House of Allah. He wanted the pagan Arabs to stop doing the pilgrimage to Makkah and divert it to Yemen. The Kabbah had been a place of pilgrimage for centuries, ever since Prophet Ibrahim and Ismail built it.

Abraha commanded his army to move forward. However, Mahmud, the lead elephant would not budge forward. They coaxed it and beat it with iron bars but it would not move towards Makkah. When ever they turned the elephant in any other direction, it would move happily, but not towards Makkah.

Allah then sent an army of birds with pebbles in their beaks and claws. They pelted the army. When these pebbles hit the army, the soldiers would start to die or fall apart. The army fled leaving everything behind. The army of birds continued their barrage until the whole army, including Abraha, died.

After the battle all that could be seen were dead people, broken up and lying scattered. Some had retreated and had died on the way back.

The people rejoiced and praised Allah for this victory. They began to pray to Allah again for a short while. This had been an example of Allah's might which took place before the birth of our prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

Allah is the our creator and sustainers, so always turn to him in prayer.



THE YEAR OF THE ELEPHANT



The army of Abraha of soldiers and elephants, were destroyed by Allah. They had travelled from Yemen to destroy the Kabbah. Allah sent an army of birds to destroy them. The birds threw stones from their beaks and claws which wiped out the entire army. This year is known as the year of the elephant.

Another significant thing about this year is that a special child was born. This child was our beloved Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). He was born in the year 571 CE in the month of Rabi-ul-awal.

Before the prophet was born, his father, Abdullah passed away. His father was sent on a trade journey where he became very ill and passed away near Yathrib. Yathrib later became known as Madina when the prophet (PBUH) went there.

When the prophet was born there was much joy in the household of Muhammad (PBUH). His mother Amina had already suffered the loss of Abdullah but was overjoyed at the birth of this beautiful baby. Straight away they took him to Abdul Mutallib who named him Muhammad - the praised one.

Muhammad was loved by everyone he came in contact with throughout his life. He spent his childhood tending sheep on the outskirts of Makkah. When he grew up he went on a trade journey for a widow by the name of Khadija. Later they both got married and lived happily for many years.

When Muhammad was 40 years old, the angel Jibrael came to him in the cave of mount Hira. The angel revealed to the prophet the first five verses of the Holy Quran. The Quran was revealed over a period of 23 years.

The verses were collect and are know as the Holy Quran which we have with us today. Not even a single word or letter has been changed since the Quran was revealed 1400 years ago.

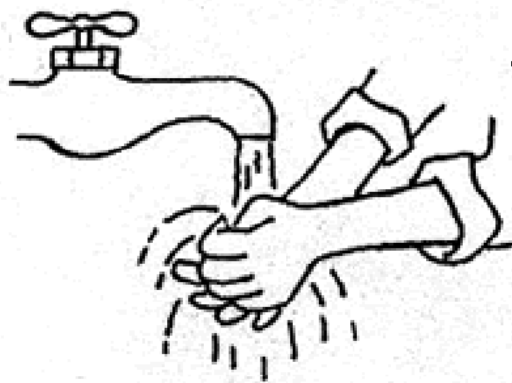

1. To answer when he says salaam (we reply by saying Wa-alykum salaam);

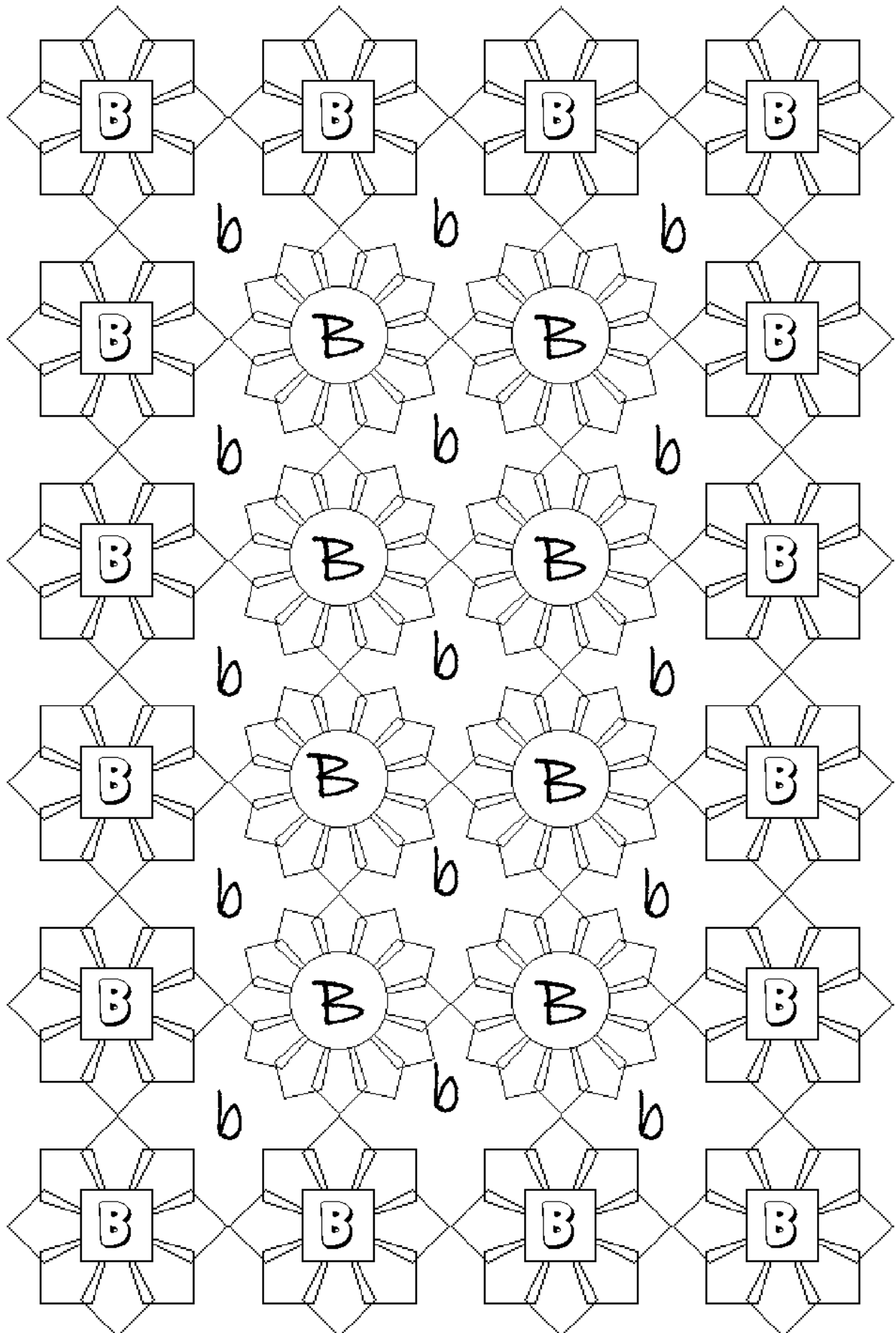
2. To visit him when he is ill;

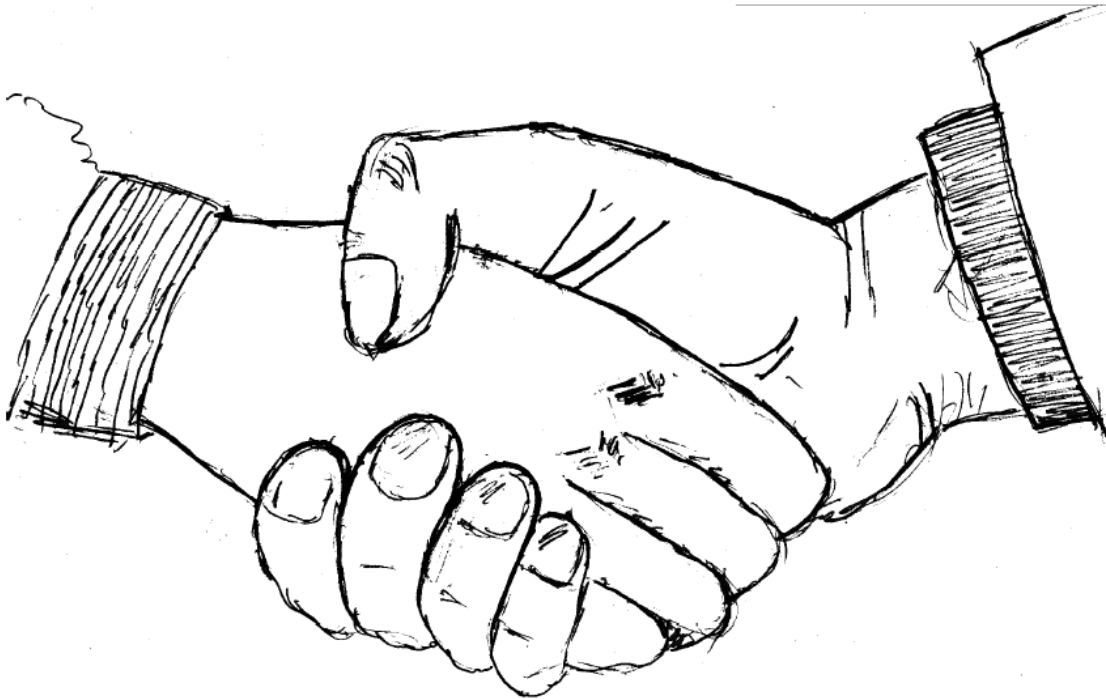

We learn, from this Hadith, the status of our Muslim brothers and sisters. Whatever good they have, they share it with each other.

A good example is after Hijra. Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) created a brotherhood between the Makkans and Madina Muslims. They shared everything and looked after each other.

The hadith is saying that this brotherhood is an important part of Islam. In fact, caring for the needs of his brother is a sign of iman.

INTERESTING FACTS

We have thousands of ahadith which have been preserved and passed down. The sanad (chain of narration) is the part of the hadith that helps us judge how accurate a hadith is. It also helps us to rule out any false hadith, thus safeguarding our deen from falsehood.

The Sanad is the source from which the Hadith came.

THE HIJRA - PART 1



The Muslims had suffered much hardship at the hands of the Makkani idol worshippers. The Muslims were few in number of which many had been freed slaves and poor people. They had passed through some hard times including the boycott by the Kafirs. They were starved and were forced to eat the leaves off trees to survive.

Finally, Allah commanded the Prophet (peace be upon him) to leave Makkah with the Muslims and travel to a place called Yathrib. This city was renamed to Medina later. Yathrib was an oasis some distance from Makkah where some Muslims had accepted Islam. These Muslims had offered protection and support for the Muslims of Makkah.

The prophet (peace be upon him) was very sad at having to leave Makkah. Many of the Muslims had already done Hijra by the time the prophet (PBUH) was ready to leave. The Makkans were plotting at this time to murder the prophet (PBUH) but by the grace of Allah the prophet (PBUH) and his companion, Abu Bakr managed to escape.

Ali took the place of the prophet (peace be upon him) in the prophet's house. When the Makkans came to kill the prophet (PBUH) they found that the prophet (PBUH) had already left and Ali was sleeping in his bed. Ali was a very brave Sahabah.

The Makkans gave chase to try and capture and kill the prophet (PBUH). They even offered a reward for Muhammad (PBUH), dead or alive. However, the prophet (PBUH) did not take the normal route to Yathrib. Instead they took a little known route and had to take shelter in a cave in the mountains. The Makkans even came to the entrance of the cave in search for the prophet (PBUH).

At the cave, they found a spider web at the entrance. The Makkans decided that there was no-one in the cave.



THE HIJRA - PART 2



The Makkans had no success in finding the prophet (PBUH). They had tried their very best. The prophet (PBUH) arrived in Yathrib, safe and sound, with his beloved companion, Abu Bakr. The people welcomed him and they rejoiced at receiving such a noble and kind person.

The prophet (PBUH) then created a brotherhood between the Ansars (helpers or people of Yathrib) and the Muhajireen (the people that had migrated to Yathrib). Many of the Muslims who migrated were poor and had to leave everything behind. Some had to leave their entire families behind.

The Ansars shared everything with the Muhajireen - this was true love and brotherhood. They became bonded together as brothers and sister. This sacrifice and sharing is an example to us to this day.

TRUE BROTHERHOOD IN ISLAM

Islam has taught mankind that we are all equal in the sight of Allah. It does not matter what colour your skin is; what tribe or country you belong to; how fat or tall you are or how much money you have in the bank! All human beings are made equal.

Allah says that we should compete in this world only in doing good deeds and good work not compete with each other in designer clothes, fast cars or in money and wealth. If we try to do good deeds and follow our deen, Allah will give us peace and success in this life and in the Hereafter.

We should never consider another person to be inferior to another. We should treat all Muslims as equal and indeed as brothers and sisters. We should care for our brothers and sisters and do dua that Allah may bless them and look after them in this life and in the Hereafter.

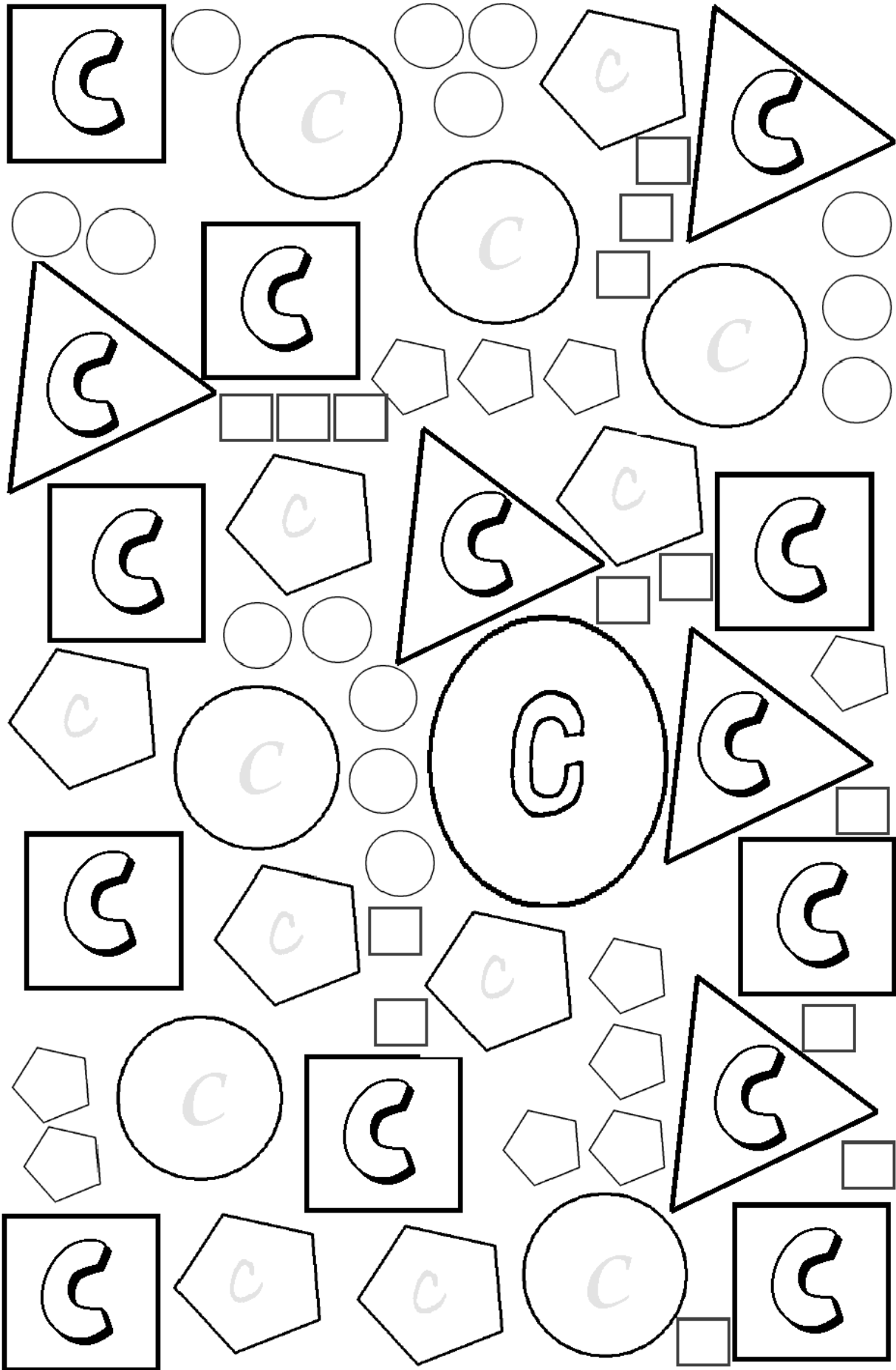

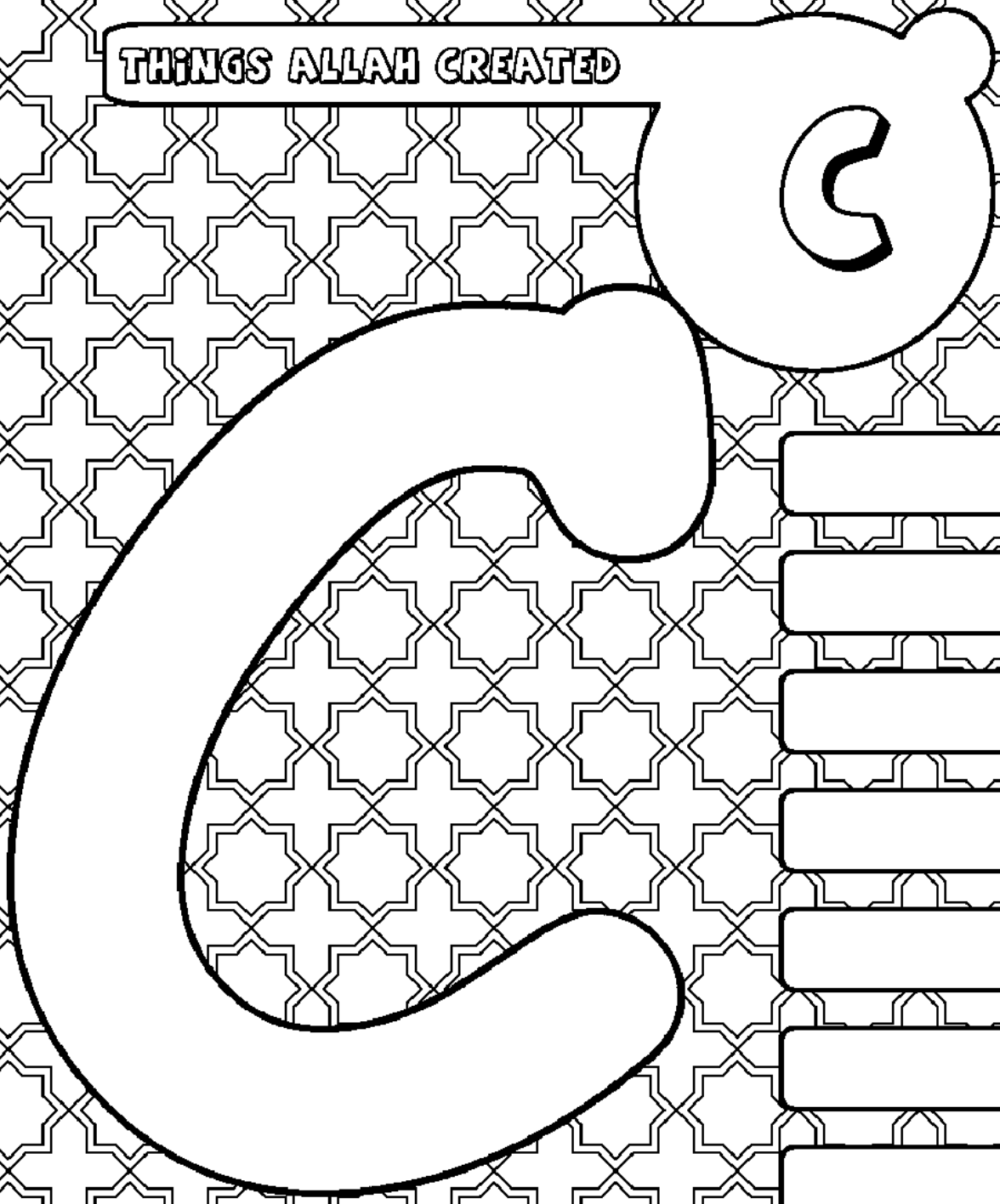

The Shaytan has been the enemy of man ever since that happened. By the permission of Allah, the Shaytan is waiting to mislead all the children of Adam, from the straight path, so that they may end up in Hell.

So be warned and remember that you have to stick to the right path. The shaytan is waiting and trying very hard to take you away from the path to Jannat.

He continued, " I was told that you have had heard some information directly from the Prophet (peace be upon him). I have come to hear this Hadith directly from you."

The reason that this man had made such a long and difficult journey was so that hearing this Hadith from Abu Darda would take him closer to the prophet (PBUH) in the chain of narration (Sanad).

Abu Darda said "I have heard the prophet (PBUH) say, whoever travels a path, seeking knowledge, Allah ta-ala will make the path towards Janaat easy for him..."

This person travelled many miles to confirm a single Hadith and make the link stronger. The blessings for studying are shown in the Hadith of Abu Darda, the students path to heaven will be made easier.

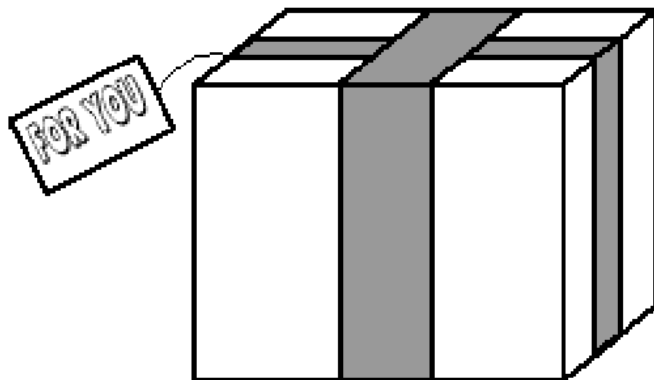

FASTING

Fasting is an act of worship given to Muslims. The prophet (PBUH) and his companions fasted regularly.

Fasting helps us to gain self control and helps us understand how poor people suffer.

When we fast, we don't eat or drink between sunrise and sunset. We can eat before Fajar and after Magrib.

When we fast we avoid all bad habits, and do as many good deeds as we can.

Fasting brings us closer to Allah and helps us see life properly.

There are 'fard' fasts, like in Ramadan, and optional fasts, throughout the year. We don't fast on Eid days.

During Ramadan, it is fard for Muslims to fast. Some people do not need to fast (E.g. the old and very young).

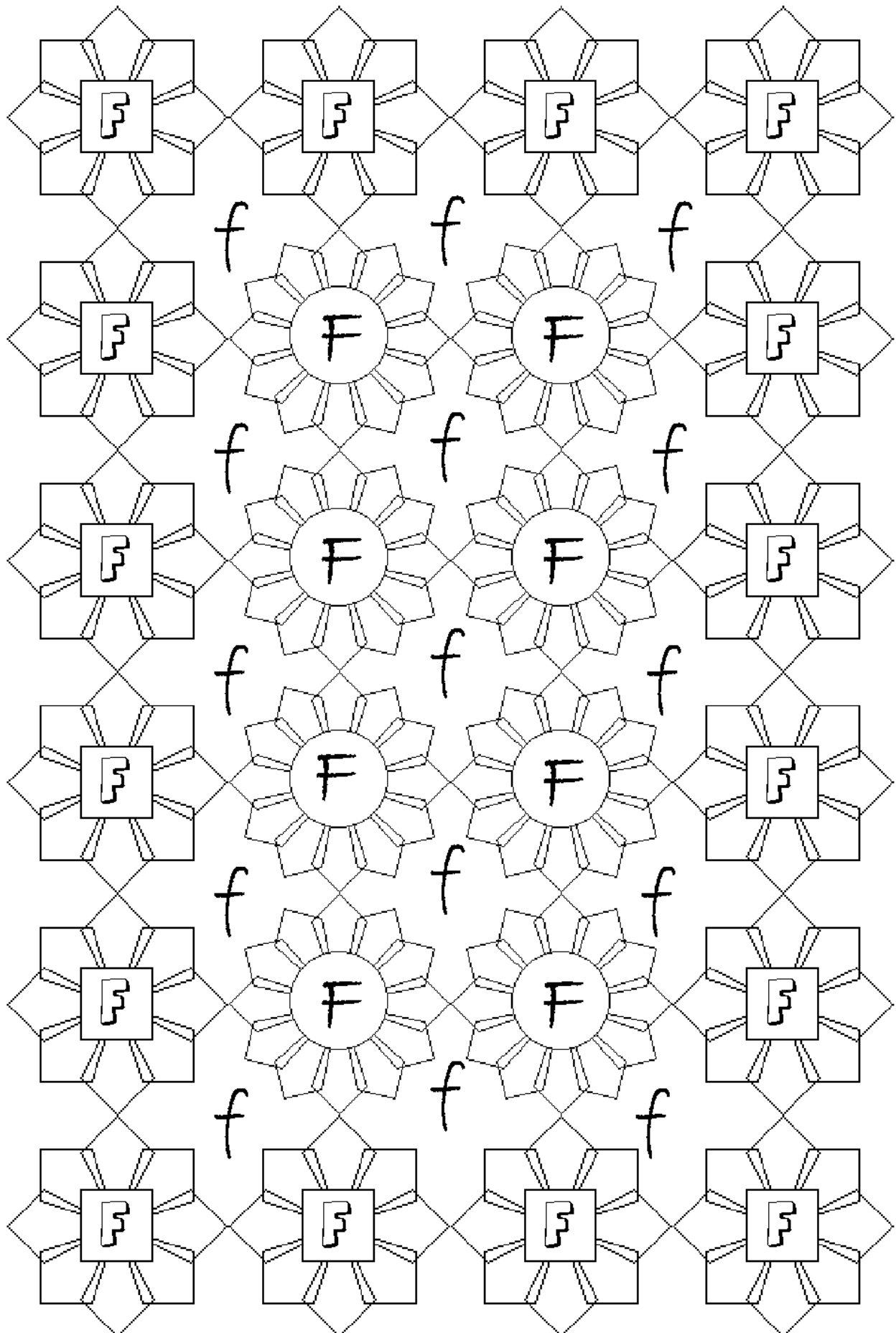
'Tarawih' is a special prayer performed after Isha. We try and complete the whole Quran within Tarawih.

The lail-atul Qadr is a special night in Ramadan. The first verses of the Quran were revealed in this night.

Ramadan is followed by Eid. On Eid, we pay sadaqat-ul-Fitr which goes to the poor to help them celebrate Eid.

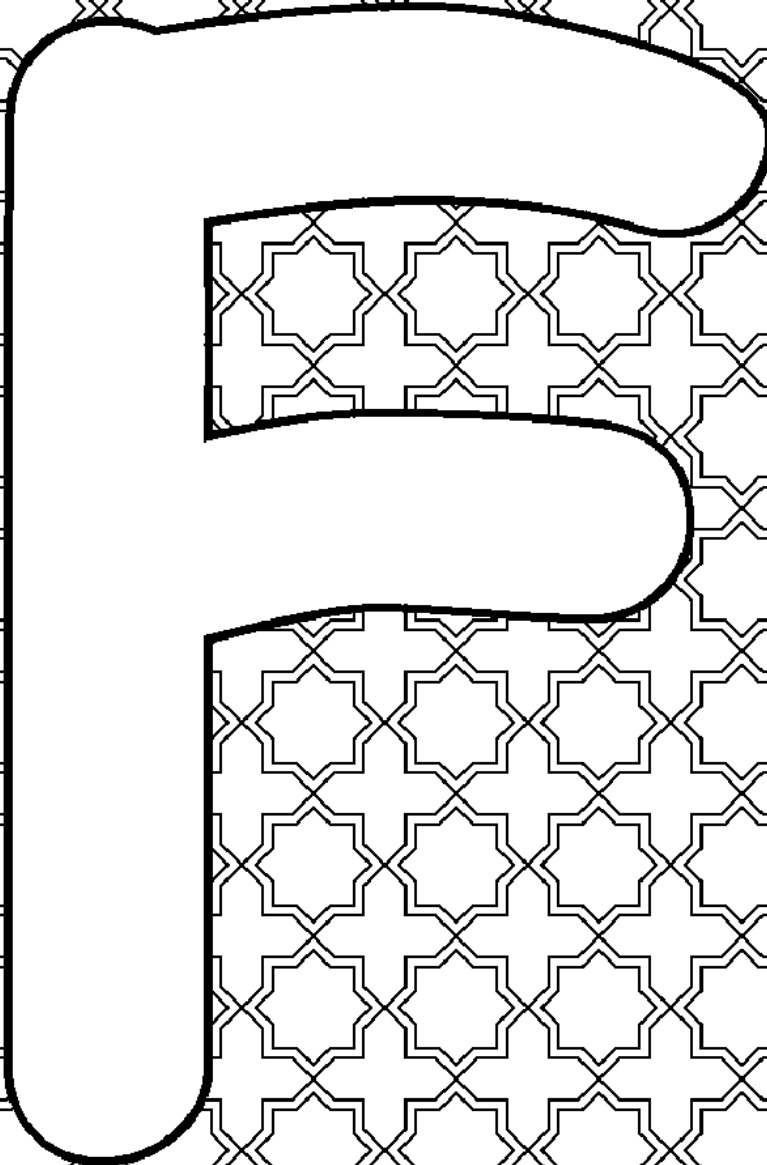

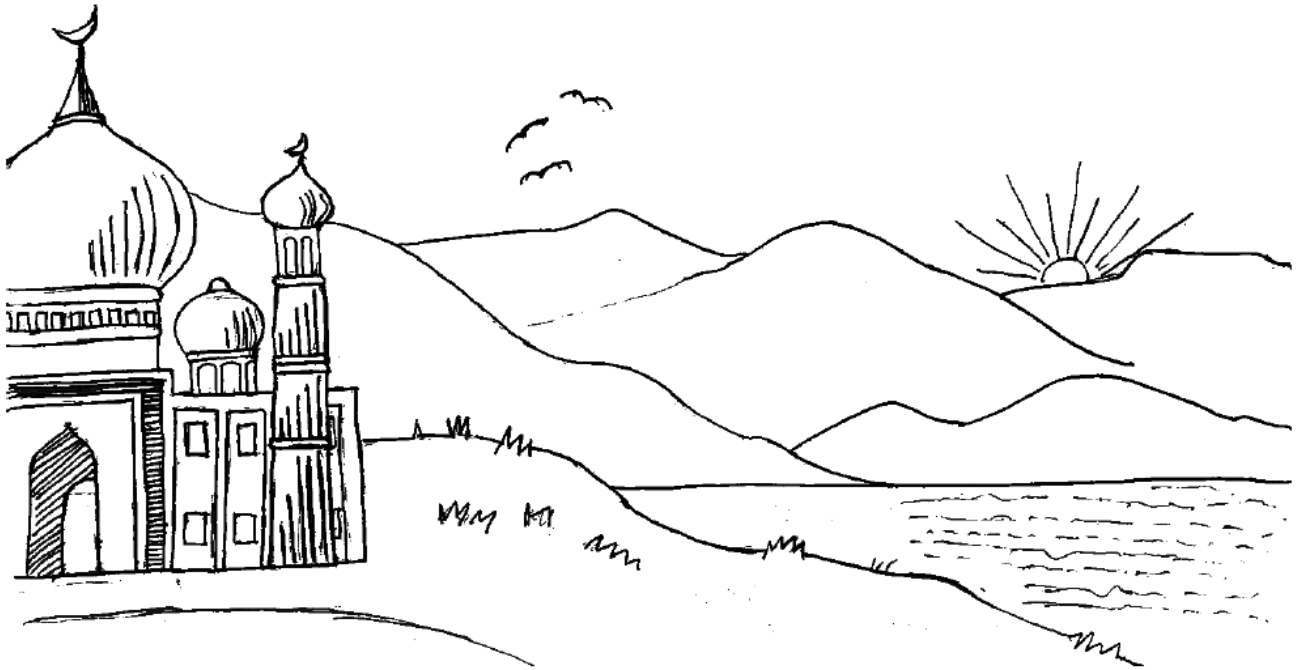

We leave behind all our bad deeds and make an effort to do more good. We worship and pray more. We read more Quran.

Ramadan is the month of forgiveness and change. May Allah forgive our sins, and bring good change within our lives.

INTERESTING FACTS

The Holy Quran is the only book to have been kept both in spoken and written form. Every Muslim memorizes some of the Quran - we use it in Salah. A person who knows all of the Quran by heart is given the title of 'Hafiz'.

One of the miracles of the Quran is its ease to memorise. There are many thousands of hafiz in this country alone.



THE STORY OF THE QURAN



During the month of Ramadan we have a special night. This night is better than 1000 months which means to worship in this night would be better than to worship 1000 months. This night can be found in the last ten days of Ramadan and is called 'lailatul Qadr' - the night of power.

Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was forty years old. He used to go away for a few days to the mountains near Makkah and spend time alone. His wife, Khadija, prepared some food for him, for the few days he was away. This was a custom amongst some of the Makkans.

The Makkans themselves used to worship many idols and do many bad things. The prophet (PBUH) himself was known to them as a good person, in fact they used to call him al-Amin, which means the truthful.

One day the Prophet (PBUH) was away in the mountains in a cave in Mount Hira. The angel Jibrael appeared to him in the form of a man and commanded him "Iqra". The prophet (PBUH) was shocked to see this person before his eyes and replied to the angel "I can not read."

The angel squeezed the prophet (PBUH) and again commanded "Iqra" which means read, repeat or recite. The prophet (PBUH) in the state of confusion and worry again replied, "I can not read".

The angel squeezed him a second time and commanded the prophet (PBUH) "Iqra". Again the prophet (PBUH) gave the same reply. The angel squeezed the prophet (PBUH) for a third time and this time recited five verses, which were the first verses of the Holy Quran.

The prophet (PBUH) repeated behind the angel and they were inscribed on the prophet's heart. These are the first words from Allah to Prophet Muhammad (Peace be upon him).



THE STORY OF THE QURAN



The Prophet (PBUH) was terrified and he ran home and told his wife. After that they went to Waraqah, a learned man, who confirmed that this was an angel that had brought a divine message to Muhammad (PBUH).

This was on this night in Ramadan that the Prophet (PBUH) got revelation. It was also the first time he had seen the angel Jibrael. The Prophet (PBUH) continued to get verses from Allah over the next 23 years. These verses are the Quran which we have with us today.

Many Muslims consider lail-a-tul Qadr as the 27th night in Ramadan. It is a blessed night, may Allah allow us to take benefit from this great month and to worship during this blessed night (ameen).

THE QURAN



The prophet was sent to Mankind with a pure message, the Holy Quran. This message that was sent to the prophet from Allah, through the angel Jibrael. The Quran was revealed to the prophet over a period of 23 years. There are over 6500 verses in the Quran. The prophet could not read or write and the words that came to him were not his own words but the words of Allah.

The Quran also has 114 chapters and is the only book in the world that is memorised by people. In fact, every Muslims must memorise the Quran. Some Muslims only memorise a few surahs and some Muslims memorise the whole Quran.

A person who knows the whole Quran, from start to finish is known as a Hafiz. There are many hundreds of thousands of Hafiz in our Ummah. From the time of the prophet until today, not a single word has been added or removed from the Quran.

We should all try our best to learn and study the Quran throughout our lives. Some people believe that if you read the Quran from the teacher once then that is enough. The truth is that we should continue to read the Quran our whole lives; we should try and memorise as much of the Quran as possible; and we should learn the meaning of the Holy Quran.

The Quran is a guidance from Allah to Mankind. It is like a map or a manual for us so that we can get the correct directions in our lives. With this guidance we should begin to change our lives according to the way Allah wants us to live our lives.

THE 5 PILLARS

Islam is based on five pillars. This means in Islam there are five very important things which every Muslim must follow.

2. Salah - To pray five times every day. The five daily prayers are Fajr, Zohr, Asr, Maghrib and Isha.

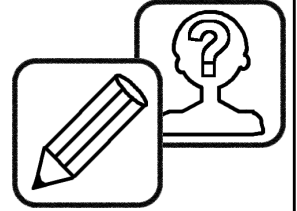
3. Zakah - To purify our wealth by giving a small amount to the poor. This is given from our extra wealth.

THE EARLY DAYS



Abu Hurairah (r) was from the tribe of Daws. After he accepted Islam he went and met Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). After a short while he moved to Madina to be close to Muhammad (pbuh) and learn from this great teacher of piety.

Abu Hurairah (r) was a very pious Muslim but the one thing that troubled him most was that his mother would not accept Islam. He would pray for her so much and hoped that she would become a Muslim as well.

One day he was telling his beloved mother about Allah and His messenger when his mother uttered some words. This made Abu Hurairah (r) feel very sad.

Abu Hurairah (r) went to see our Prophet (pbuh) with tears still flowing from his eyes. When the Prophet (pbuh) asked him why he was so upset, Abu Hurairah (r) related the whole story. Abu Hurairah (r) then asked our Prophet (pbuh) to make dua for her.

Abu Hurairah (r) was very pleased when prophet Muhammad (pbuh) made dua for his mother. He was sure that his mother would accept Islam one day soon.

When Abu Hurairah (r) got home, he heard the splashing of water and then his mother told him to come into the house. When Abu Hurairah (r) entered, his mum said, "*La-ilaha illallah Muhammadur Rasoolullah*" which means she had accepted Islam.

The tears began to flow from Abu Hurairah's (r) eyes but this time they were tears of joy!

HADITH SOURCES

The Sahabah were the companions of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). They passed down information about the Prophet (pbuh) and about his life to the next generation. They also passed down any advice and teachings the Prophet (pbuh) had given them.

These sayings were then collected by later scholars and put into books. There are many great Hadith collections and great Muhadith (Hadith scholars) that came in the later generations.





ISLAM

Islam is the deen of the Muslims. Islam is an Arabic word which is taken from the words peace and submission.

We submit to Allah by choosing to follow His guidance in everything we do. This means we must not do anything against Allah's wishes.

When we follow Islam properly, there is peace: peace in our lives; peace in the community and peace in the world.

Islam is not an ordinary religion but is a way of life. Islam is the way of life for all the Muslims in the world.

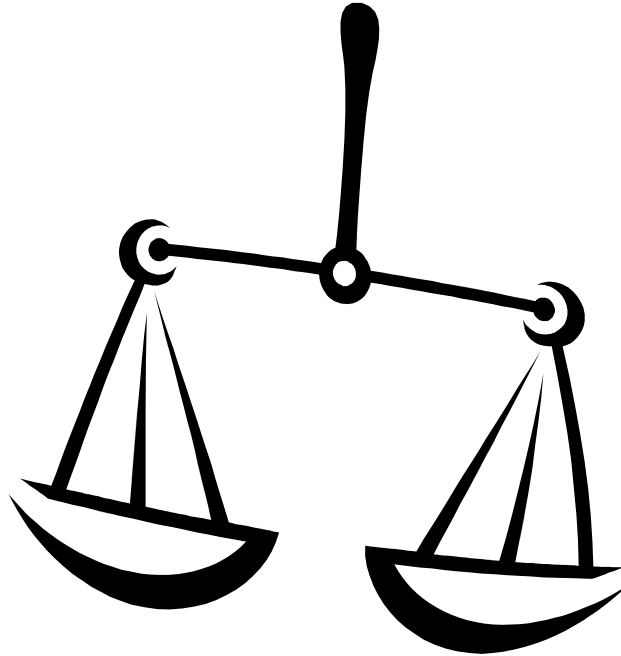

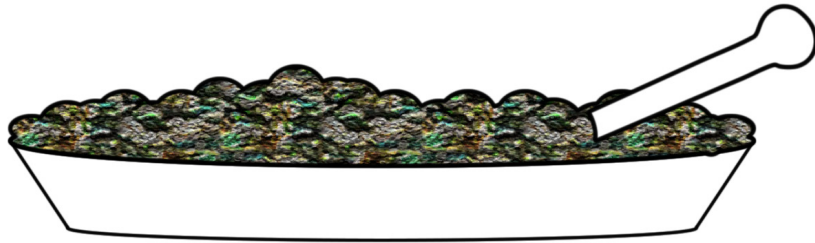

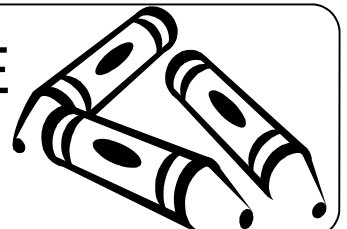

The first part is to bear witness that there is only one God - Allah - Who alone we worship.

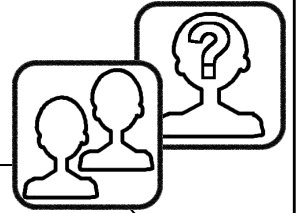
The second part is to bear witness that Muhammad (pbuh) is the last and final messenger of Allah.

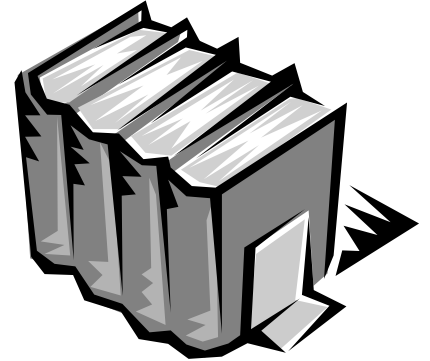


AL HADITH

THE EARLY DAYS



Abu Hurairah (r) would spend all his time in the company of our Prophet (pbuh) learning about Islam. Abu Hurairah (r) would even accompany our Prophet (pbuh) on all his journeys and different expeditions.

Many people would come to Abu Hurairah (r) and ask him questions about our Prophet (pbuh). Abu Hurairah (r) was blessed with such an amazing memory that he would be able to teach the people so much about Islam.

Many years later, at the time of Marwan Ibn al-Hakam, Abu Hurairah (r) was called to the court of Marwan. Marwan wanted to test Abu Hurairah (r) and see how good his memory really was. Marwan setup a test during which scribes would secretly write down every hadith Abu Hurairah (r) related.

As Abu Hurairah (r) taught, the scribes were busily recording all this valuable knowledge onto their scrolls.

A year later, Abu Hurairah (r) was invited back to meet Marwan. He was asked to relate ahadith as before. Abu Hurairah (r) related the same ahadith, exactly as he had done a year earlier.

Later Marwan and the scribes were comparing these hadith and the ahadith that Abu Hurairah (r) had related a year earlier. They were astonished to find that both sets of ahadith were identical, word for word.

Marwan was very impressed with the memory of Abu Hurairah who was such a honoured teacher and transmitter of hadith.

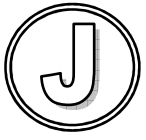
HADITH PARTS

There are three different parts to a Hadith:

1. The Sanad is the chain of narration - from whom to whom the information was passed until it came to the collector.
2. The Matn is the actual text of the Hadith.
3. The collector is the scholar who recorded the Hadith.

These three parts of the Hadith are scrutinised by the scholars before writing them down in their books.

to this land with another army to patrol the area and to restore peace, harmony and prosperity.

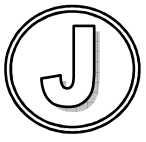

HAJJ

Hajj is the fifth pillar of Islam. Muslims must make the pilgrimage to Makkah at least once in their lifetime.

Although people can visit Makkah anytime, we can only perform the Hajj in the Month of Zul Hijjah.

During Umrah and Hajj, we walk around the Ka'bah seven times then we drink some zam zam.

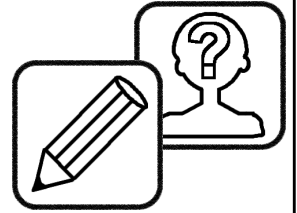
We then walk between the hills of Safah and Marwah (Sa'i), 7 times. We then cut our hair or shave our head

During Hajj (8th til 13th Zul Hijjah), we spend time in Mina, Arafah and Muzdalifa. We do the Rami of Jamarat.

During these days, Hajjis wear the Ihram- two pieces of white unstitched cloth. Women just wear simple clothes.

Mina is often called 'tent city' because when the Hajjis go there, they stay in tents. There are millions of Hajjis so you can imagine how many tents there would be. They arrive in Mina on the first day of Hajj from Makkah and spend the day there. They spend a total of three days in Mina. It is easy to get lost in Mina because it is so big and the tents look similar.

IBRAHIM (AS) & THE KA'BAH

Ibrahim (as) was a great prophet. Once he came to visit his son, Ismael (as), in Makkah. He had not met Ismael (as) for a while and was longing to see him. Ismael (as) had grown up and started his own small family. Ismael (as) was returning home from hunting when Ibrahim (as) met him. Ibrahim (as) and Ismael (as) both embraced each other and were so overjoyed.

The command was given to Ibrahim (as) to build a house, dedicated to the worship of Allah. Together Ibrahim (as) and Ismael (as) started building this Masjid, known as the Ka'bah. They built it near the spring of Zamzam, close to the hillocks of Safah and Marwah.

As they were building the Ka'bah, they were unable to reach the higher parts of the wall. The stone Ibrahim (as) was standing on would rise up and down, allowing the wall to be built. To finish the walls, they needed a corner stone but could not find a suitable one. Jibrael brought them a pure white stone from Jannah to complete the building.

Ibrahim (as) and Ismael (as) completed the building and fixed the corner stone. Ibrahim (as), by the command of Allah, invited the whole of Mankind to make the pilgrimage to this holy place.

For many years Makkah remained a city of peace and goodness. Later, evil crept into the community and soon the people began to put idols in and around the Ka'bah.

Ibrahim (as) had dedicated this building to Allah, the one and only true God of mankind. Mankind had polluted this pure truth by putting

false gods in this holiest of places.

It was only when Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) came did he restore it back to its original state. People have been making the pilgrimage to Makkah from the time of Ibrahim (as) until today. Billions of people have visited this holiest of places.

The Ka'bah was built by prophet Ibrahim (as) so that people would come here and worship Allah. However as time went on people began to pollute this holy place by putting idols in and near the Ka'bah.

Allah also made us and put inside us our hearts - a place where only Iman would stay. Iman is the true belief in Allah and only Allah without assigning partners to Him. In other words, the heart is a place of tawheed just like the Ka'bah was built as a place of tawheed.

Over time, the Ka'bah became polluted when idols were placed at the Ka'bah by the people. We have to be careful that this does not happen to us inside our hearts.

For example, if we start doing things which Allah has told us not to do then we have polluted the pure Tawheed inside our hearts. We chose to obey someone or something else instead of obeying Allah's command!

So next time someone tells you to do something bad which goes against Islam you need to tell them, "No! I'm a Muslim and I must do what Allah says."

THE EARLY DAYS



When Abu Hurairah (r) moved to Madina, he experienced extreme poverty and would often be hungry. The Muslims of Madina were very poor in those days. However, he pursued his wishes to learn from the greatest teacher Muhammad (pbuh) and he dedicated all his time to this.

Sometimes he would suffer from such extreme hunger that he would tie a stone to his stomach to reduce the pangs of hunger. In one incident, he was so hungry that he waited for one of the Sahabah to invite him home for something to eat.

The Sahabah passed him by but when Muhammad (pbuh) passed by, he (pbuh) realised the situation of Abu Hurairah (r) and invited him home.

At the Prophet's house there was only a bowl of milk to drink. The Prophet (pbuh) invited all the people of 'Ahl as-Suffah' to his house. Such was the blessing that they all drank from this milk.

Abu Hurairah (r) lived in a poor state for a long time. After our Prophet (pbuh) passed away, Abu Hurairah (r) was appointed governor of Bahrain and he also got married and had a daughter.

During this time, he became very wealthy from gifts given by people and also from breeding horses. However, he remained a simple person and refused to let this wealth change him.

He would spend much time in the worship of Allah. In fact, he would worship Allah one third of the night, his wife worshipped the second third and his daughter worshipped the final third. In his house, the worship of Allah would remain all night long.

HADITH SOURCES

The 'Sihah Sittah' are the six most authentic Hadith collections. They are listed below and are used widely by the Muslim Ummah.

Bukhari and Muslim are the top two Ahadith collections. They were extensively researched and also have the toughest criteria for Sahih Hadith.

Other Hadith collections are also referred to and used by the scholars.

The oldest collection is the Muwatta of Imam Malik.

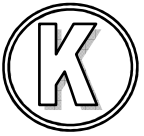

The Ka'bah forms the shape of a cube. It has no windows. The door is about two meters from the ground.

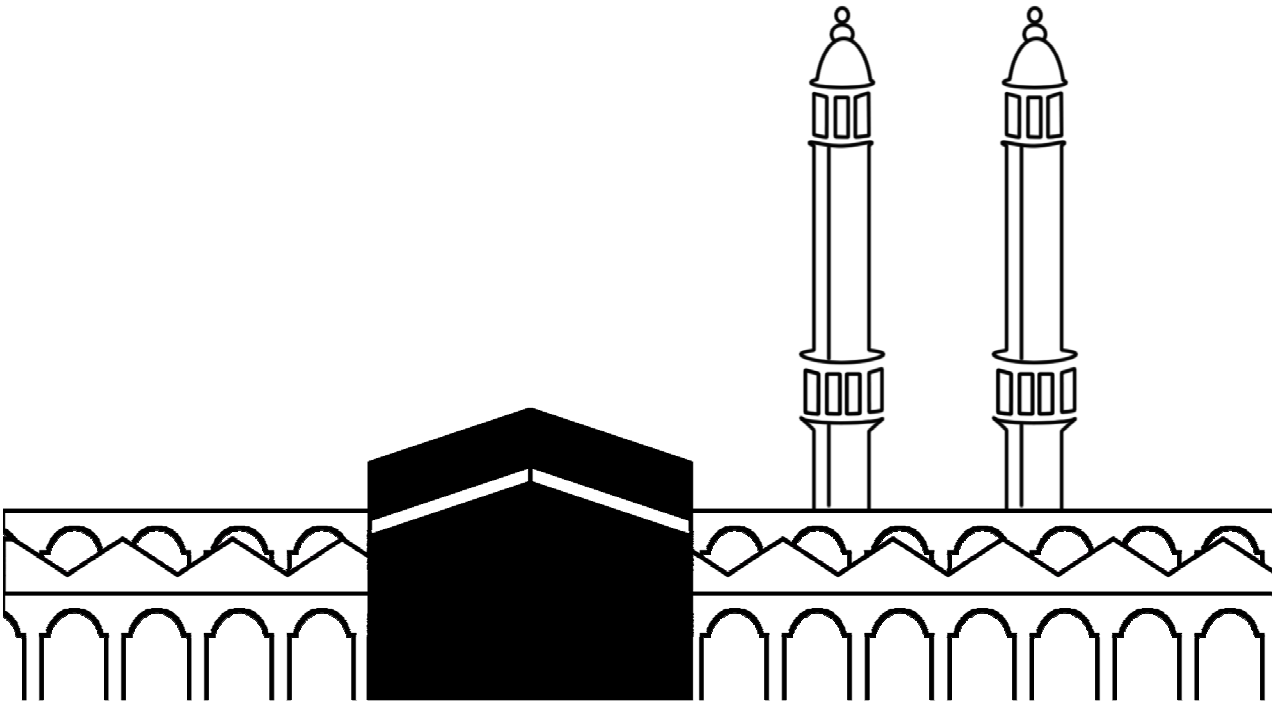
The Ka'bah has a Hateem (looks like a small semi-circular wall) near it. It was originally part of the Ka'bah.

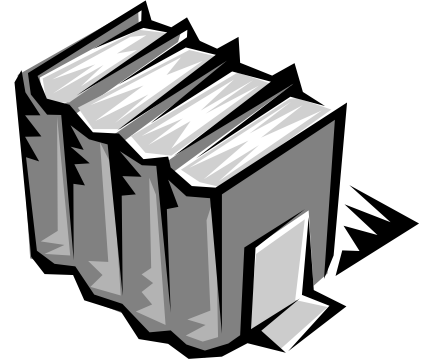
AL HADITH

The day of Arafah is the most important day of Hajj. The Prophet (pbuh) said that Hajj is Arafah.

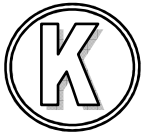
People stand from noon until sunset in the plains and on the slopes of mount Arafah. They make dua to Allah.

THE GREAT SACRIFICE

Ibrahim (as) was a prophet of Allah. Even today he is respected by all revealed religions of the world. There are many great stories in his life and many lessons to learn from this great man. There is one story in particular which has great significance today.

Ibrahim (as) had a dream in which he was commanded to sacrifice his son to Allah. Ibrahim (as) was very worried because he loved his son so much. This dream appeared to him a few times and he knew that this dream was true. Ibrahim (as) was a prophet and a prophet's dream is equal to revelation.

He spoke to his son Ismael (as) who replied, "Do as you have been commanded." Ibrahim (as) decided that he would carry out the command to sacrifice his son, just as he had been commanded to do in his dream.

Ibrahim (as) set off with a heavy heart towards the place of sacrifice. He travelled with his beloved son, Ismael (as), as he made his way through the land. Suddenly, the Shaytan appeared to him and tried to stop him from obeying Allah's command. Shaytan tried many things such as reminding him how much he loved his son.

The Shaytan appeared to Ibrahim (as) three times and each time Ibrahim (as) chased him away by throwing small stones at him. Finally, Ibrahim (as) arrived at the place of sacrifice; he blindfolded himself so that he would not see the face of his beautiful son whom he loved dearly.

After the sacrifice he removed the blindfold. Ibrahim (as) was

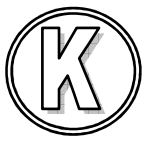

The dream was a test from Allah to see if Ibrahim (as) could sacrifice everything for Allah. Ibrahim (as) had passed this difficult test.

During Hajj, the pilgrims still throw small stones at a place called the Jamarat. They throw seven stones at each of the three pillars, which represent the shaytan. They make a sacrifice afterwards just as Ibrahim (as) did. This is all part of Hajj. In every country, Muslims make Qurbani (sacrifice) and distribute the meat to the poor, their family and friends. This special Qurbani is on this day of Eid ul Adha.

THE EARLY DAYS



Abu Hurairah (r) was just a youth when he accepted Islam. He travelled with At-Tufayl (r) to Madina and met Muhammad (pbuh). When Muhammad (pbuh) asked him his name he replied that it was Abdu Shams which means servant of a sun.

Our Prophet (pbuh) gave him a new name of Abdur Rahman (servant of the most Beneficent).

However, this is not the name he was known with.

Abu Hurairah (r) use to look after a cat. He would feed, carry, clean and shelter this cat. The cat became so attached to Abu Hurairah (r) that it would be with him wherever he went. For this reason he became known as Abu Hurairah (father of the cat).

In Madina, he spent all his time in the company of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). Unlike others, he would not go to the markets to earn money or invest his time in other pursuits. His whole life was dedicated to learning from the Prophet (pbuh). In fact, he didn't get married during this time.

His dedication to knowledge meant that he had to suffer much poverty and hardships. Throughout his years of learning he would endure extreme hunger and poverty. However, because of his dedication he was able to learn a great deal from Prophet Muhammad (pbuh), more so than many of the other companions.

Abu Hurairah (r) was unable to write but his cast iron memory ensured that he could learn so much and retain this information for future generation.

Abu Hurairah was seventy eight years old when he passed away.

HADITH CLASSES

The Scholars have divided the hadith into different groups. These groups give us an idea of how accurately the Hadith has been researched and how accurately it has been preserved.

The scholars examined the Hadith, the Sanad and Matn and were able to classify the Hadith.

These groups or classes include:

- Sahih (authentic),
- Hassan (good)
- Da'eef (weak)
- Mawdu (Fabricated).

A Muslim should be pious so must follow the deen of Allah closely and with sincerity.

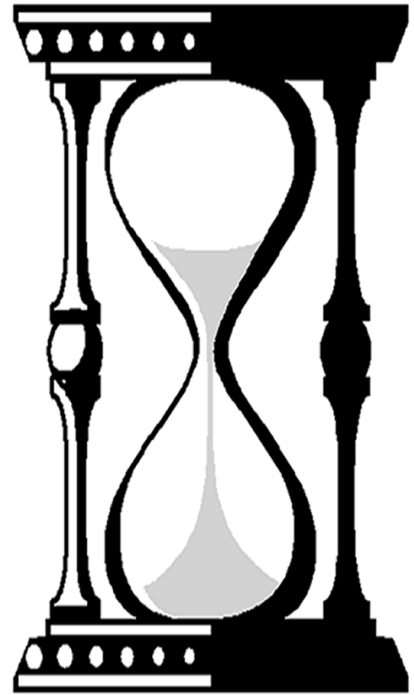
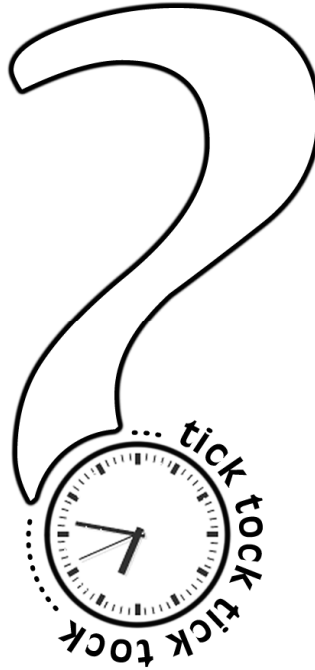
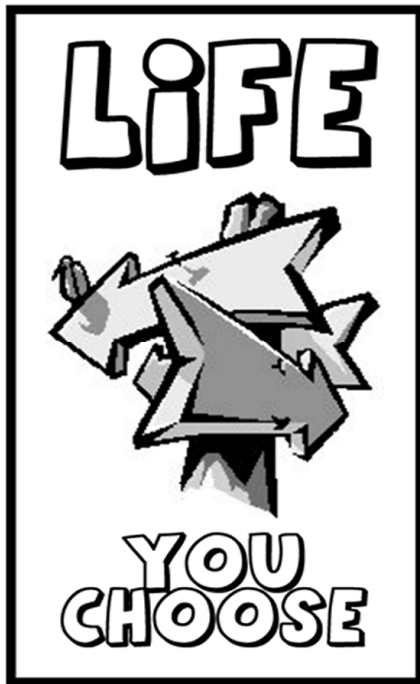
A Muslim should be considerate and should respect the feelings and rights of other people.

We only appreciate how great these blessings were when Allah takes them away. So start using them now and take advantage of them.

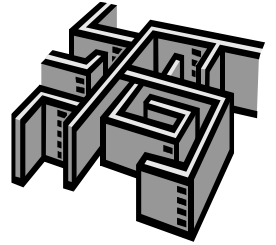
How many Hadith are there?

There are several thousand Ahadith in one collection and there are many hundreds of Hadith collections. As you can see there are mountains of Ahadith and they contain lots of information about Islam.

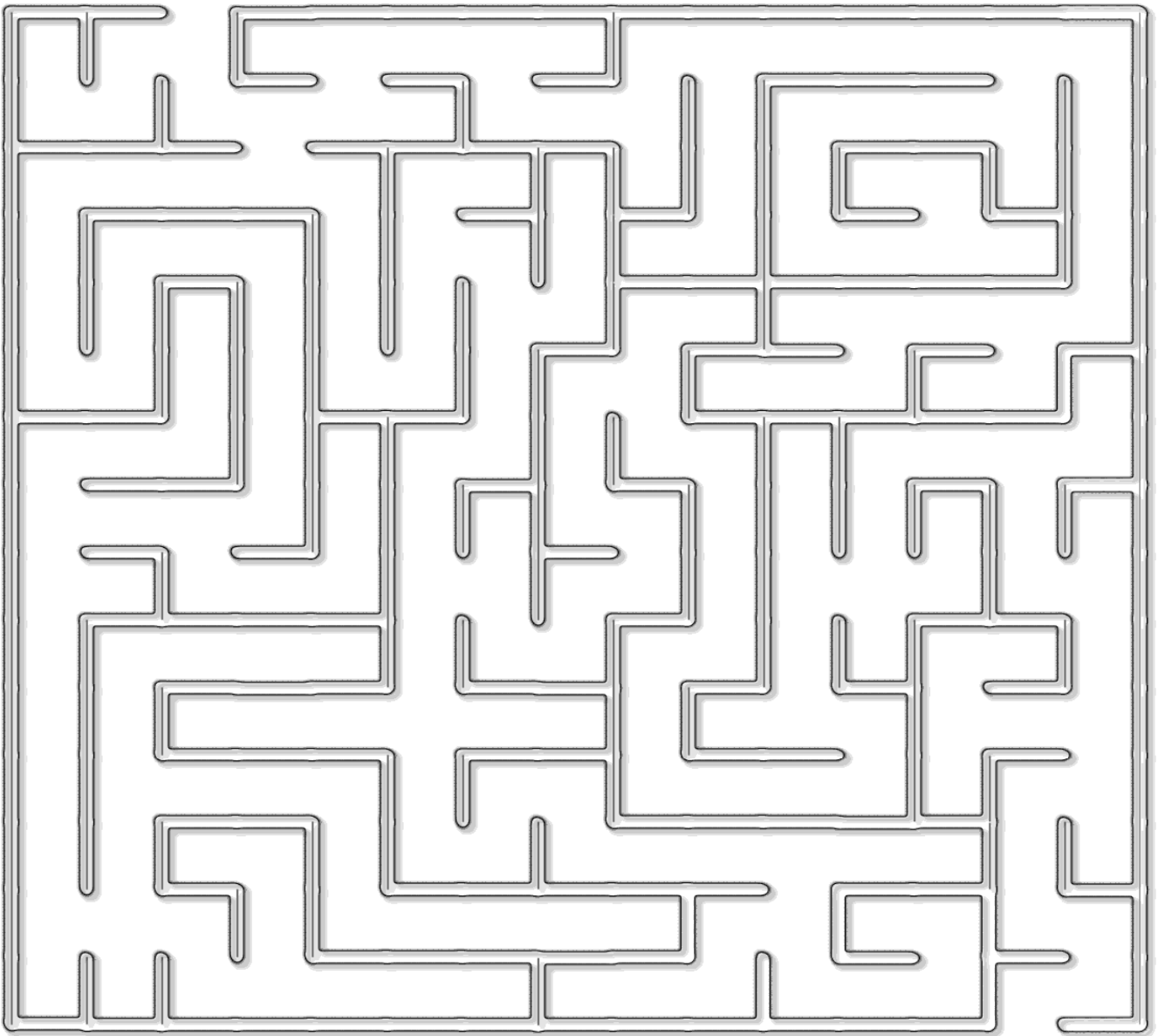
